



ASP is an organization that seeks to achieve systemic change for those experiencing extreme poverty in the Appalachia region. Because systemic change is a long and arduous process, ASP also partners with groups throughout the year to help provide hand-on help in local communities where alternative aid was dried up and/or is unavailable. ASP recognizes that this is not a permanent solution, and also uses this opportunity to educate their volunteers about how they can become more involved to help promote and enact positive systemic change. Faithful Politicking: One Book to Encourage; One Book to Challenge; One Book to Throw Across the Room

Two evenings of conversation on Zoom (zoom.us/j/8347173468 PW 200) Wednesday, August 3 from 7-8 pm; Thursday, August 4 from 7-8 pm

This summer, you are invited to come along on a journey of those too-often taboo topics of faith and politics. How should we address these topics as people of faith? Three books have recently been published to address this growing divide in our country. Each book represents a very different viewpoint. We Will Not Be Silenced: Responding Courageously to Our Culture's Assault on Christianity, by Erwin W. Lutzer, has been widely revered and celebrated in



conservative and evangelical circles. Not In It To Win It: Why Choosing Sides Sidelines the Church, by Andy Stanley, offers a moderate approach. Jesus Takes a Side: Embracing the Political Demands of the Gospel, by Jonny Rashid, highlights the importance of unabashedly standing with the oppressed. As our subtitle above implies, you will assuredly not agree with each of these books. Instead, the hope and goal is to help us to step out of our echo chambers and work to have authentic conversations with those who think differently than we do—starting from a foundation of faith. On August 3, we will focus our conversations on the readings, and how the various books impact our faith and actions. On August 4, we will shift our conversation to where we go from here. August 8–13, Rochester Area






Yoga on the Lawn with Brett Richardson

This is a class to help you start or build your yoga journey. We will work on improving strength and flexibility as well as techniques to help calm the mind, body, and soul.



Brett currently teaches in Rochester and the greater Rochester area. 




Yoga at Asbury First

Wednesday, July 27, 3-4:30 pm, Library



Help Tend the Asbury Community Garden!

It's planting season! The Asbury Community Garden is taking shape for 2022, with seeds starting to germinate (lettuce, radishes, collard greens, carrots and Swiss chard) and seedlings (broccoli and tomatoes) taking up their new residences.

Lots is happening and lots more needs to happen. Several groups have already lent a hand. The Youth Ministry topped off our raised beds with soil and mulched the paths around the beds. The Children's ministry has started flowers and basil plants. And the Asbury Day Care Center is going to paint some large planters to hold our nasturtium flowers that will help attract pollinators.

Could you join us? Our biggest need is for people to join the rotating teams of gardeners watering and, eventually, harvesting the vegetables. Watering is particularly crucial as seeds and seedlings are planted, but continues through the growing season until October. Team work is shared among many people. You might need to water and pick vegetables one or two times over a week in coordination with your team, and then return a few weeks later to do the same. If you want to do more, we have more jobs to share. Experience is not necessary.
