
Bess Phillips Retiring



Tuesdays, Beginning September 13, 12-3 pm, Room 205 (Bell Room), \$20 per person



- 6-7 pm Wesley Singers & Ringers, Vocal & Handbell Choir for 2nd-5th grades




Women On Wednesday (WOW) embraces Hope on September 28




Yoga at Asbury First




CONTINUING CLASSES, GROUPS, AND EVENTS

Wednesday, August 24, 3–4:30 pm, Library



Returns Wednesday, September 28, 5 pm, Zoom


