



Rev. David Lubba is presented with the Congregational Cane

Sunday, June 16, long-time Asbury First member, Rev. David Lubba, received the honorary Conference Cane—a cherished symbol within the Upper New York Conference of the Methodist Church held by the longest continuously serving clergy member. Crafted from timber salvaged from Michigan's first Methodist Episcopal Church which burned in 1841, the cane carries a rich history dating back to the pioneering days of Methodism, when the Genessee conference extended west from Quebec City to Detroit, and south to northcentral Pennsylvania.

Rev. Lubba's journey to this moment began in South Attica, where at just thirteen years old, he felt called to ministry while working the fields. His path led him to serve faithfully not only in Upper New York but also for nine impactful years as a missionary in the Republic of the Philippines.

The Cane was presented to Rev. Lubba on Sunday by Rev. Rachel Dupont during the 11 am service. He attributes his journey to God's guidance and is thankful for the love and support of the Asbury First congregation.

The Cane was previously held by Rev. Norman Parsons, who passed away in September, 2023. As David holds the cane, he becomes part of a legacy that connects him to the early days of the Methodist church — a reminder of faith, service, and the enduring power of God's love.








Men's Devotional Group

4th Wednesday of the Month, 3-4:30 pm, Library




