Director's Update -

- A snapshot piece of COC stats as a handout for (Dining In For Outreach) DIFO event. For example, August: 990 meals
 533 people were assisted in Storehouse
 129 showers
 41 loads of laundry
 80 bags of groceries
 38 bikes repaired
 20 haircuts
- Temple Beth El will provide the volunteers to serve Christmas Eve and Christmas Day meals.
- New Hires: A dishwasher has been hired to work between 6-8 hours/week, while another assistant will start next Wednesday working 15-20 hrs/week and will be present at all meals to start and will eventually add some storehouse duties.
- Volunteer staffing update: Generally well-staffed at the moment. DCC has consistent teams of regulars but could use more subs to cover for times when regulars are out. Storehouse has plenty of volunteers at the moment. They are receiving more donations of goods and clothing than can be processed some days.
- The DCC probably won't be adding additional days just yet. Still settling into the current schedule and operations. No plans for an evening meal yet. Serving approximately 70/day currently.
- DIFO proceeds will primarily fund COC programs as opposed to off-campus ministries (offCMs).

Volunteer Orientation Sessions held:

Gandhi Institute Training:

- Will be either on Tues.10/24 or Thurs.10/26. Will run about 2 hours 6-8 pm. Training is to give attendees an understanding of and skills needed when working with individuals in crisis. Event will include a presentation followed by interactive role-playing.
- Director is participating in a "minister's training" during a 12-week program sponsored by the Kairos Center, a national organization committed to building a movement to end poverty.

DIFO Update (Erica):

- After just one Sunday info table presentation in the Gathering Center, signups include 3 hosts and 12 guests. News of DIFO will be printed in weekly bulletins; pre-service slides on monitors will include info on DIFO; and the DIFO info table will be in the Gathering Center every Sunday until the event.
- Other notes on DIFO: Many people tend to wait to sign up. Lists have been created of business sponsors that will help fund/supply the appetizer portion of the evening to be held at the DCC.

Other News:

• Asbury Community Garden was recently honored at City Hall and was featured on Channel 13 News as a "Bright Spot" program in the community.
